You should hang a Christmas stocking so your parents can fill them up!

Christmas is one of the most anticipated times of the year. For most people,
Christmas means getting with family, getting presents, decorating the house,
putting up a tree, and eating lots of awesome desserts. One of the most iconic
parts of Christmas is the stocking. It's pretty simple: a sock of some sort or a sock
shaped bag that's hung over the fireplace on Christmas Eve and filled with small
toys, candies, and other things often referred to as stocking stockings.

But why do people use stockings in the 1st place? Is it just one of those traditions someone started and other people liked it and caught on, or does it have a much deeper history behind it?

Christmas stockings are often thought to originate from a legend of a recently widowed man with 3 daughters and no money.



Saint Nicholas heard of this and came to the family's home, and fill the girls' stockings, which had been hung over the fireplace to dry. He placed gold in their stockings so that they could get married. In another version, there's a very poor family, and the father was planning on selling his daughters to save them all from starvation. Saint Nicholas knew the man wouldn't accept charity, so he gave them gold in their stockings in secret.

This folktale has been retold countless times and has been adapted with many variations. However, for the most part, it always featured saint Nicholas filling stockings.

This is actually how Saint Nicholas became known popularly as a gift giver. In some stories, Saint Nicholas filled the stockings with gold balls, so 3 oranges became a symbol of Saint Nicholas in some places too.

Saint Nicholas, who we often refer to in today's world as Santa Claus, was a Christian bishop who lived in the time of the Roman empire. He was known for many miracles and was often referred to as Nicholas, the wonder worker.

We often hear that stockings get filled with toys and candies for good children and coal for children who misbehave, which originated in western culture to get kids to act good pretty much.

Some have claimed that the tradition goes back to Scandinavian cultures prior to Christianity during Yule, where Odin would ride on an 8 legged horse and give children gifts in exchange for food to feed his horse.

Still, this claim is not accepted by most scholars and historians. With their iconic red sock design, stockings have become one of the most interesting Christmas traditions.
